ADHD

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is a neurodevelopmental disorder that begins in childhood and involves psychological and behavioural features that can negatively affect all aspects of life, including school, work, and relationships. It is characterised by persistent symptoms of inattention, hyperactivity, and/or impulsivity. Treatments that target both biological and behavioural factors can be helpful, and evidence shows that outcomes are more effective when medication and behavioural treatments are combined.

Our Services

At the Nelson Clinic, we offer a streamlined ADHD assessment and treatment service.

ADHD assessments are conducted by trained psychologists. If treatment is recommended, an appointment can be booked with our ADHD coaching team and/or our psychiatry team.

ADHD Assessment 6+

We undertake comprehensive assessments to address questions about the existence and diagnosis of ADHD.

Appropriate diagnosis involves identifying symptoms, understanding how the symptoms are exhibited in the person's life, and excluding other conditions that may look like ADHD.

ADHD Coaching 6+

Coaching can help create strategies that can be used to manage ADHD symptoms.

ADHD Coaching involves educating clients about:

- ADHD
- Executive functions
- Genetic involvement and how this affects certain behaviours during childhood and adulthood
- Anxiety and mood problems
- How to change different aspects of their life to reduce the problems that ADHD symptoms cause

ADHD Coaching typically involves a series of sessions that focus on managing executive functions like:

- Organisation
- Planning
- Time management
- Motivation

Coaching sessions are tailored to suit clients' needs.

This service is available to anyone and does not require a diagnosis.

ADHD Medication 6+

Medications can help alleviate ADHD symptoms.

ADHD Medications work by adjusting biochemistry within the brain, and while not curative, these medications have been shown to be highly effective in reducing the symptoms and difficulties associated with ADHD.

This service is available for children and adults.
