Health Trust extending its reach in Pelorus



The Pelorus Area Health Trust (PAHT) has always given out donations and grants to fund various health initiatives in the Pelorus area. This year has seen a change in focus for the Health Trust. It is now operating some direct initiatives itself, in order to plug some gaps in what the board sees are needs in the community. The hot soup run has now been operating for a year, taking a thermos of hot soup, sweet treat and a roll to over 30 recipients.

The hot soup is now made and distributed from the new Community Lounge that PAHT has established in Havelock. This warm and cosy lounge is a place for community groups to have a meeting, for people to drop in to find out some health information, have a cuppa and a chat, or in the future, come along for a meal and some activities.

The Lounge will also be used to run St John's courses on first aid refreshers, mental health awareness, how to use a defibrillator, and also for Pet Therapy sessions to be held.

The expansion in terms of shop space and offerings as well as in terms of the services PAHT provides for the wider community is all about making connections and helping people. It does bring new challenges as PAHT now needs more volunteers than ever to staff the two charity shops and the Community Lounge and to do the Hot Soup run. These volunteers are the engine and the heart of all of the services PAHT provides, and they are so proud to be helping to make a difference in our community.
