Principal's Panui

Kia ora,

Term 3 marks the beginning of my third year as tumuaki and kaitiaki of Waitaria Bay School and the opportunity to reflect, celebrate and plan ahead. Over the past two years much has been achieved in terms of overall property development, which is clearly visible to all, including most recently the cyclical whole school repaint. I truly appreciate all the affirming feedback from the local and wider community and the recognition of all the hard work that goes on behind the scenes to make everything happen. The new fit for purpose Hazchem shed is a real asset and has meant that we can make better use of the space underneath the office which is now much safer for everyone.

Many hours have been spent on the organisation and storage of the teaching resources. Better access and knowing where everything is kept and can be found, has revealed where further resources are needed to support various learning areas of the curriculum. This is an ongoing process and somehow we have managed to fill four skips in total over the past two years.

Along with our newly introduced motto and revised values, the Waitaria Bay Curriculum is taking shape while adjusting to the various government mandated changes and Ministry of Education directives and initiatives. The proof is in the pudding and I've recently been able to share with the Board our overall

We are seeing the benefits and results of the Better Start to Literacy approach, across the board. I'm looking forward to seeing similar results for maths in the near future.

The Picton Christmas Parade is on Sunday 1st December 2024 - starting top end of High Street from Police Station at 2.30pm.




Aotea Electric Marlborough is rolling out a donation program Kids in Sport aimed at helping fund participation in sport or activity of your choosing.
