Principal's message

One of the highlights of this term has been the return of the various Pelorus Cluster events and the ability for our students to attend. This has largely been due to the generosity and willingness of our parent community to transport our tamariki to and from the various events, even if this means a very early start. I'm pleased to be able to announce that I have secured funding to support the travel component and that this funding will be available to reimburse parents. The classroom programme has been enhanced by dipping into the Aotearoa New Zealand Histories component of the Social Sciences curriculum, exploring aspects of Wellness with Brit from Hato Hone/ St John's and incorporating some of the techniques we learned and the introduction of our new approach to literacy which has seen a positive response from all of our students. These will be consolidated into the daily/weekly timetable next term. We are looking forward to Miss Keane returning for Term 2 and her teaching days will be every Monday and every second Friday.
