Matariki marks the time when the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades are visible in the early morning sky, so although the public holiday is for one day, Matariki itself lasts a little longer. During Matariki we are encouraged to honour those who have passed during the year (July to July), to celebrate the present, and to look to/plan for the future.

The community Stargazing evening with the Omaka Observatory is the perfect opportunity to celebrate the present. While this is a community event being supported by the Marlborough District Council, Waitaria Bay School is providing a sausage sizzle and hot mile throughout the evening.


